

- No dancer will be permitted through the team gate, or perform, without their waiver.

MDTA Music Policy 2023



All recordings used in dance routines at MDTA contests should comply with U.S. copyright law. Music should be legally purchased or obtained. Coaches will not have to complete or submit any form regarding their music to compete in an MDTA contest. By competing in an MDTA contest, all coaches and teams acknowledge the rules of MDTA and agree to abide by them.

Therefore, coaches can create mixes of various songs as long as they have legally purchased the music. It is the coaches responsibility to have proof of purchase, but proof of purchase will not be requested by MDTA.

Music will be submitted ahead of time for State 2023 by February 12th

• Make sure to have a labeled back-up (school name and category) CD of the music or on an ipod, iphone (phone), MP3 player, or ipad.

• The coach, manager or non performing member with knowledge of the team's music and routine MUST remain with the music technician throughout the duration of the team's performance. A music tech will be available to start the music if the team's representative is not comfortable doing so.

- If there is a pause in the music, you MUST let the music person know PRIOR to the team's performance.
- Selection of music is at the discretion of the director but MUST be appropriate for a family audience (no profane/vulgar or suggestive lyrics)

How Are Divisions Determined for the State Championships?

One year you may find yourself in one division, and the next year in a completely different one. Regardless, each year the executive board is approached with the question:

"How Are Divisions Determined for the State Championships?"

Here is MDTA's process of determining where your team competes for the state championships:

All schools are required to send their enrollment numbers to MSHSSA in mid September. Once those have been submitted MSHSSA creates the school enrollment numbers for the document. These numbers stand for the entire year EVEN if your school numbers increase or decrease.

These numbers are requested from MSHSAA dance representative, Davine Davis, to use for the state division breakdown (these are also available to all on their website www.mshsaa.org).

Once the team registration deadline has passed, schools are placed in ranking order from highest enrollment to lowest enrollment. The total number of teams that have entered are then divided into six even divisions.

At times there may be a slight variance to those even numbers when teams drop from the state championship.

Once the team divisions have been set, MDTA does not readjust due to team drops because it will affect other variables of the competition such as session times and category divisions. MDTA understands sometimes teams "ride the bubble" which means they may switch divisions often. Ultimately, the division you are in depends on how many schools enter and the size of the schools which make up the performing body of teams. State is just around the corner, and I hope you are feeling secure about all of your tricks and moves!

We have made a few changes in how we notify coaches whether they incurred safety penalties or not. Some changes are necessary because of the set-up of the facility and some changes were made in an effort to avoid hold-ups. Also, we have tried to avoid having others, including your competitors and collateral members of your team, see what decisions have been made regarding safety.

So...coaches will enter the floor with their team and sit in the designated chairs to watch them perform. When the performance is over, <u>do not exit</u> with your team until you check the safety table, which will be behind you, to see what safety decisions have been made. It may take a few seconds, but a rectangular red or green paper will be placed on an easel. If you see green, you are free to leave the floor and join your team. If you see red, you should move towards the exit, but instead of joining your team, you should sit in the chairs near the trophy table. Once the safety team has completed their review, you will be notified if a penalty was given or not. If there was a penalty, an explanation will be provided to you via the liaison. At that time, you will have an opportunity to ask guestions.

We sincerely hope to give very few penalties, and wish you safe dancing as well as good luck for beautiful performances!

Are You Up To Date on the Spirit Rules?

As coaches, we set rules and guidelines we expect our dancers to follow. It is our duty as a coach to lead the way and follow the rules and guidelines set forth by our state and federal associations.

Listed below are rules most often violated and reported to MSHSAA and MDTA.



Modesty Rule for Dance Costumes

Missouri dance teams and soloists are expected to wear costumes that are appropriate for educationbased activities and approved by the local school administration for **performances and competitions**. It is the school coach(es) responsibility to be knowledgeable of all NFHS and MSHSAA rules regarding dance and to convey these rules to any company or individual providing a service to the school team or soloist (i.e. choreographers, seamstress, prop designers, etc.).

1. When the participant is standing at attention, no part of the buttocks, breast, or midriff shall be visible

2. Midriff is defined in Missouri as 3 inches above the belly button all the way around the body. Teams may have a cutout or open back costume. However, if the cut is below the natural waist line in the back the costume is illegal.

- 3. Bare skin, nude-colored coverings or any material that gives the illusion of flesh shall not be part of the costume in the midriff area.
- 4. Footwear must comply with NFHS Rule 4-1-5.
- 5. Participants shall not be permitted to perform/compete in illegal attire.

Jewelry (Section 6, page 13)

Jewelry, etc. shall **not** be worn during practice, games, performances or competitions.

<u>All</u> safety rules found in the spirit manual pertain to every practice, performance (assemblies, games, etc.), and contests, including Nationals. Failure to follow the safety rules can be reported to MSHSAA.

- Most Likely To Be a Dance Coach Award
- Lights Up the Stage Award (Best Showmanship)
 - (Best Facials, Overall Performance)
- Team Jokester Award
- Triple A-Awesome Attitude Award
- Gumby Award (Most Flexible)
- Miss/Mr. Preparation
- Miss/Mr Coachable
- Memorization Award
- Best Pirouettes, Best Leaps, etc.

Ask your school if you can repurpose old dance trophies not on display anymore and replace the plates with your awards to give to dancers.

<u>Event Ideas</u>

• Hold a Trivia Contest!

Include Questions for Parents/guests on:

- 1. The total number of hours practiced
- 2. The total number of routines performed.
- 3. Number of games/events attended.
- Give a coaches speech featuring the accomplishments of the year, as well as funny moments of the season.
- Present a Slideshow with Videos and photos of the season
- Be sure to thank anyone who helped throughout the season. Include parents, bus drivers, custodians, administration-Be sure to send them an invitation to attend your banquet!
- Have your senior dancers perform one final time-A good song choice is "Last Dance"
- Present gifts to your Seniors. Possible Gift Ideas include:
 - Alumni Shirt
 - Framed Team Photo with notes/signatures
 - Photo Album/Memory Book
 - Personalized letters
